SUMMARY FINDINGS



Labour market statistics play a key role in socio-economic planning. In April, 2012, the Statistical Institute of Belize (SIB) conducted a labour force survey to understand the size, composition and dynamics of the labour force in Belize. This national household survey is a very versatile and powerful tool for identifying and monitoring problem areas in the labour force and for decision making.

Introduction


This report presents selected results on some of the key socio-economic topics covered in the survey and on a subset of labour force indicators classified by different population characteristics.

Standard Labour Force definitions and concepts are as follows. Relationships between the definitions are presented in Figure 1.

- Working age population: Persons 14 years or older
- Not in the Labour Force: Members of the working-age population who do not have jobs and who do not want jobs.
- Employed Population: Persons in the working age population with jobs.
- Unemployed Population: People who do not have jobs but who want to work.
- Labour Force: Those persons who are either employed or unemployed

- Labour Force Participation Rate = $100 \times \frac{Labour\ Force\ Population}{Working\ Age\ Population}$



SUMMARY FINDINGS

I UNEMPLOYMENT RATE


1.1 Country

The unemployment rate in the country of Belize at April, 2012 was 14.4 percent. This rate expresses the percentage of the labour force that is not currently working. The Cayo District has the highest unemployment rate in Belize at 18.3 percent: the lowest rate is 12.1 percent in the Belize District. Stann Creek District was the only other district with an unemployment rate above the national average (15.3 percent).




1.2 Area and Sex

There is a small difference in the unemployment rates for urban and rural areas (urban 14.9 percent and rural 14.0 percent). However, there is a marked difference in unemployment rates between males (9.1 percent) and females (22.3 percent). This reflects patterns seen in previous studies where the unemployment rate for females was more than twice that for males. For comparison, in April 2007 the male and female unemployment rates were 5.8 percent and 13.1 percent respectively.




1.3 Ethnicity

In Belize, the Maya have an unemployment rate of 18.6 percent which is slightly higher than the rates of the Garinagu (17.4 percent) and the Creole (16.2 percent). While the Mestizo recorded the lowest unemployment rate (13.6 percent) among the five major ethnic groups, they accounted for almost one-half (49.0 percent) of the unemployed population.



1.4 *Age*


It is clear from Figure 5 that youth 14 to 24 years old are the most critically affected by unemployment. Their unemployment rate is about twenty five percent (25.3 percent) compared to about twelve percent for persons between the ages of 25 and 44 years and 55 to 64 years. The population 45 to 54 years old reflect the lowest unemployment rate (7.8 percent) possibly due to the general unwillingness to switch jobs given that they are so close to retirement.



1.5 Country of Birth and Attending School

Clearly unemployment rates differ by country of birth. Highest unemployment rates are experienced for persons born in Belize (16.2 percent). Persons born in Guatemala are next likely to be seeking employment (unemployment rate of 11.0 percent).

Although only about seventeen percent of persons in the labour force were attending school at the time of the survey, Figure 6 does indicate that the unemployment rate for this small number of persons was 30.0 percent. Evidently, persons attending school were active in looking for employment.





II. LABOUR FORCE

2.1 *Country*

About 65.2 percent of persons or 148,093 persons of working age in Belize are in the labour force, that is, they either had a job or would have been available if one was offered to them. The Corozal District has the highest proportion of working age persons in the labour force (71.0 percent) while the Toledo District has the lowest at 53.2 percent (Figure 7). Both Orange Walk and Stann Creek Districts had labour force participation rates below the national average.


Figure 8 provides the percentage of persons in the labour force in the country of Belize across all six districts which is consistent with the distribution of the population. For example, the Orange Walk District which has 13.9 percent of the total population had 13.4 percent of the labour force and the Belize District with 29.7 percent of the total population had 31.5 percent of the labour force.





2.2 Labour Force District by Sex


In each district males outnumber females in the labour force (Table 9). The difference between shares is greatest in the Toledo District where 69.1 percent of the labour force is male and females make up 30.9 percent. The smallest difference between the sexes occurs in the Belize District (males 55.6 percent and females 44.4 percent).




2.3 Area and Sex

In urban areas, two out of every three persons, 67.1 percent, are in the labour force while in rural areas it is slightly less at 63.9 percent (Figure 10). Nevertheless, there are more persons in the labour force in rural areas than in urban areas (urban 48.3 percent and rural 51.7 percent) (Figure 11).

Figure 10 also indicates that about 79.4 percent of males 14 years or older are in the labour force while for females only 51.9 percent are in the labour force. Indeed most of the persons in the labour force are males (59.7 percent) (Figure 11).



2.4 *Ethnicity*



There does not seem to be much variation in the labour force participation rate from one ethnicity to the other.

According to Figure 12 rates range from the highest for the Mestizo (67.6 percent) to the lowest for the Maya (58.8 percent).

Mestizo accounted for the majority of the labour force are Mestizo (51.9 percent from Table 13).

According to Census 2010, the population distribution by district is Mestizo 49.7 percent, Creole 20.8 percent, Garinagu 4.6 percent and Maya 9.9 percent. Clearly these population percentages are in good agreement with the distribution of labour force by district given in Figure 13.


It is expected that ethnicities with smaller numbers will contribute less to the labour force.


2.5 *Age*

It is clear that labour force participation is highest within the most productive years of life (25-34 years at 81.0 percent, 35-44 years at 82.6 percent, and 45-54 years at 78.4 percent) (Figure 14).

Only about a half of youth 14 to 24 years old were in the labour force and participation in the labour force falls off quickly for members of the population who are older than 65 years.


Figure 15 indicates that about threequarters of the labour force were less than 45 years old (73.6 percent). The age group 25 to 34 years contributes 26.2 percent of the labour force while the second largest number of persons in the labour force are young people 14 to 24 years old (24.5 percent).





2.6 Education


The Belize labour force is relatively uneducated with almost three quarters having a primary or less education (no education 45.9 percent and primary education 28.8 percent). Using the criterion that a person 14 years or older with a standard 5 or better education is literate, it is clear that at least 45.9 percent of the labour force is not literate.





2.7 Country of Birth and Attending School

Most persons in the labour force attend no type of school (95.8 percent). Of the remaining 4.1 percent attending school, 1.7 percent attended on a part time basis. Among those persons not attending school 73.7 percent are in the labour force (Figure 17). Evidently, full time students are least likely to have jobs and want work and so few are in the labour force (11.6 percent). Most (88.1 percent) of the part time students are in the labour force.

As would be expected, most (78.0 percent) persons in the labour force were born in Belize. Over ten percent were born in Guatemala (10.3 percent) with a small percentage (1.0 percent) born in Mexico.








III UNEMPLOYED LABOUR FORCE

3.1 Country and District


When the distribution of unemployed persons by district (Figure 20) is compared with the labour force country's population distribution it is seen that the Cayo District had a disproportionately large percentage (30.2 percent) of unemployed persons. In contrast, the Belize District, which was home to almost one-third of the labour force, accounted for only 26.4 percent of unemployed persons.



3.2 *Area and Sex*


The unemployed labour force is approximately equal in urban (49.8 percent) and rural (50.2 percent) areas (Figure 21).

Figure 21 also indicates that one and a half times as many females (62.3 percent) as males (37.7 percent) are unemployed.




3.3 *Ethnicity*

It is clear that most of the unemployed are Mestizo (48.9 percent) and Creole (27.0 percent). However, since the ethnic distribution of the unemployed labour force across ethnicities is approximately equal to the total population distribution by ethnicity, there is a high degree of balance in the ethnic composition among the unemployed population.



3.4 *Age*



Unemployment is most prevalent among the youth 14 to 24 years (42.9 percent) (Figure 23). Almost eighty-five percent of the unemployed are less than 54 years old (83.3 percent).

Since only about one-fifth of the country's total population are youth, it is clear that this age group is over represented among the unemployed.

The high incidence of unemployment among the youth is perhaps to be expected as this age group is typified by persons just out of school actively looking for employment with little education and experience.

3.5 *Length of Time Without Work*

Almost a half (45.9 percent) of the unemployed labour force has been without work for more than twelve months (Table 1) and about a quarter of them (26.7 percent) have been unemployed for seven to twelve months. The Cayo District is most severely affected with 57.2 percent of the unemployed labour force without work for more than 12 months. Urban and rural areas seem to be affected at equal rates but differences exist for the sexes: females seem to fare better than males for shorter times without work (less than twelve months). However, for time without work more than 12 months, about a half of females (51.3 percent) have been unemployed for more than twelve months compared to about a third of males (36.7 percent). In general females experience longer periods of unemployment than males.

Almost forty-five percent of youth 14 to 24 years old remain unemployed for more than a year.

3.6 Sector of Last Occupation

Among the almost fifteen thousand five hundred unemployed persons who had worked before, almost three-quarters (73.2%) of them last did so in the service sector, with just under 40 percent of them performing as clerical, service/ sales workers. A slightly smaller percentage (37.4%) was engaged in elementary occupations.

About a tenth of the unemployed (10.1 percent) worked in the primary sector: they were skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers. Over fifteen percent (15.2 percent) of the unemployed labour force worked as plant and machine operators and in craft and related trades (secondary sector) (Table 2).

3.7 Education

Almost a half (10, 483 persons or 49.1 percent) of the unemployed have not completed any level of formal education (Figure 24). Of these unemployed persons with no level of formal education, about a third (32.1 percent) are found in the Cayo District and almost two-thirds (63.5 percent) are females (Table 3).



IV EMPLOYED LABOUR FORCE

4.1 Country and District

Most of the employed persons (32.4 percent) reside in the Belize District. However, since about thirty percent of the country's population are residents of the Belize District, it is clear that Belize District's contribution to the employed labour force is proportional to its population. In general the distribution of the employed labour force by district is approximately equal to the population distribution (Table 4). A similar statement can be made for the urban rural distribution of the employed labour force.




4.2 Area and Sex

Most of the employed labour force in urban areas are males (54.7 percent) and similarly, in rural areas, only 31.1 percent of the employed persons are females (Figure 25). At the country level, also, males outnumber females in the employed labour force (males 63.4 percent and females 36.6 percent). It should be noted that most of the employed persons are rural dwellers (52.0 percent).



4.3 *Ethnicity*

Over a half of the employed persons are Mestizo (52.4 percent), but this percentage is reflective of the relative size of the Mestizo in the total population. Males outnumber females in the employed labour force for all ethnicities. The largest difference occurs for the Maya ethnic group where 74.5 percent of the employed labour force are males (Figure 26).



4.4 Age

A little over two-tenths of the employed persons are youth 14 to 24 years old (Figure 27). Employed males in this age group outnumber employed 14 to 24 year old females two to one (17,868 males and 9,171 females) (Table 5). The majority of the employed persons (67.9 percent) are 25 to 54 years old.







4.5 Education

Fourty-five percent of the 126,722 employed persons have no education. Evidently, almost three-quarters of the employed labour force have at most a primary school education.



4.6 Main Occupation

Almost a third of the employed labour force (30.9 percent) work in clerical, service and sales jobs, and about a quarter of the employed work in elementary occupations such as cleaners and helpers, food preparation assistants, agricultural and fishery labourers and construction workers.



V POPULATION

5.1 Country, District and Average Household Size

The April 2012 labour force survey estimates that the total population of Belize was 338,936 persons. Males and females occur in almost identical numbers in the country (Table 6) with females numbering 169,467 persons. Stann Creek is the only district which exhibits a marked percentage difference between the sexes (males 51.8 percent, females 48.2 percent).






Average household sizes are presented in Figure 30 where the national average at April 2012 is estimated to be four persons for each household. The Belize District has the lowest average household size at 3.4 persons while a high of 4.5 persons is recorded for both the Corozal and Toledo Districts.



5.2 *Urban-Rural Population*

In the April, 2012 labour force survey, urban dwellers made up 45.1 percent of the total population (Figure 31). The rural population dominates in four of six districts with only Belize and Cayo Districts having urban majorities. Figure 32 suggests that males are slightly less numerous in urban areas than females and more numerous in rural areas than females





5.3 Population Under 14 Years

In the under 14 year age group, which totalled 112,588, males are slightly more numerous than females (males 51.7 percent, females 48.3 percent). Table 7 indicates that the surplus of males under 14 years old can be found in the rural areas where 52.6 percent of the rural under-14 year old children are males.

In general the distribution by district of under-14 years old children follows the distribution of the country's population.







5.4 *Male Population 14 Years and Over*

Males make up approximately fifty percent of the population 14 years or older in each or four district. The two exceptions are the Corozal District (48.5 percent males and 51.5 percent females) and the Belize District (males 48.2 percent and females 51.8 percent).



5.5 *Urban-Rural Population 14 Years and Over*

Persons 14 years and over are more numerous in rural areas (urban 47.1 percent, rural 52.9 percent). Females outnumber males in urban areas and are of equal numbers as males in rural areas (Figure 34).
